Follow England's coastline to explore heritage dating back millennia up until the modern day



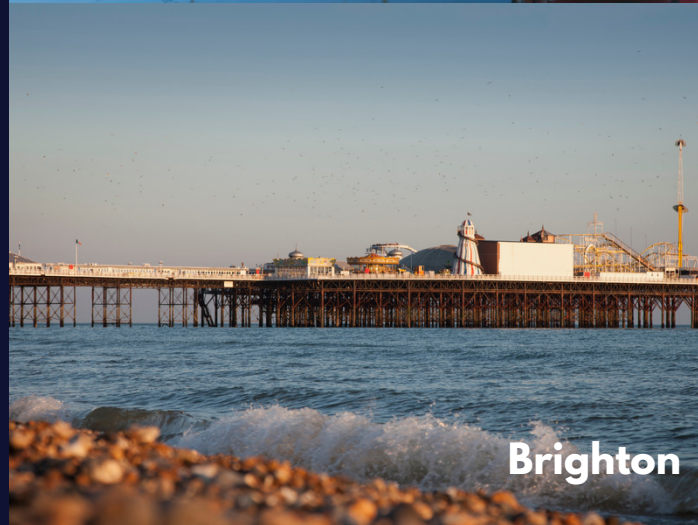
THE PROJECT

The England's Coast project covers 6 diverse regions, each with their own unique heritage and identities. Each region is named for the defining characteristic that makes that region distinctive. The Yorkshire Coast is the Heritage Coast, including Scarborough, Whitby, and the North York Moors National Park.

Northumberland on the North East coast is Wild Coast, while East Coast is the Natural Coast, and includes Hull to Harwich. The South is the Jurassic Coast, boasting Dorset and East Devon. The South East is the Cultural Coast, covering Brighton and Eastbourne, while Devon and Cornwall are the South West.

SOUTH WEST - SOUTH DEVON & CORNWALL HIGHLIGHTS

Known as the 'English Riviera', the South West enchants with its perfect sandy beaches and picturesque fishing villages, eye-catching in their characteristic pastel palette. Walk the South West Coast Path and take in the breathtaking beauty of this region.



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YORKSHIRE - HERITAGE COAST

Be charmed by the original Victorian seaside resorts that sprung up here along the coast, or lose yourself in the wilds of the North York Moors. The Yorkshire coast boasts a rich and diverse heritage that appeals to both nature lovers and beachcombers.

EAST COAST - NATURAL COAST

Famous for its wealth of nature and wildlife, the East Coast offers a fully immersive experience in the English sea- and countryside. Indulge in some bird watching and seal spotting along the coast, or even people-watching in the local, traditional villages.

SOUTH EAST - CULTURAL COAST
